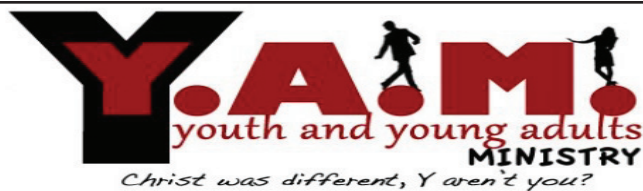

CATHOLIC STRONG



I am pleased to report that the members of the Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Strong Committee and myself have concluded our solicitations of the Leadership, Major Gifts and Advanced Gift stage of the Campaign.

With a proposed Parish Campaign Goal of raising \$710,000.00 we would hope to secure 70% of these funds exclusively for our church (which equals \$497,000.00) over the next five years of pledges/gifts.

The Catholic Strong Appeal will draw to a close during April. Seventy percent (70%) of these funds will be available twice per year: June and November for the next five years to be applied to our projects.

According to the most recent campaign finance reports published in the Catholic Star Herald, Our Lady of Sorrow has collected \$200,000.00 to date in generous gifts and pledges. We started our planning meetings and our work in late September and now we have reached mid-February. The economy, family and personal obligations and job market uncertainties clearly reflect the times in which we live here in Atlantic County.

I am grateful for the many who have already made a sacrificed pledge and to those who will respond during our General In-Pew solicitations weekend coming up in March.

I would highlight two exciting pieces of news: Several families and individuals have come forward and designated generously their intent to gift and memorialize the following items.

- ♦ The new Church Carillon and Bell Console.
- ♦ The new Eucharist Monstrance designed for dramatically displaying up to a 6" diameter host during Perpetual Adoration.
- ♦ Contributions towards the renovation of the Usher's Room have been designated as a daily Adoration Chapel space.
- ♦ Contributions towards the creation of the two new vestibule restrooms.

I am deeply grateful to everyone and cannot wait to see even more projects become reality soon!



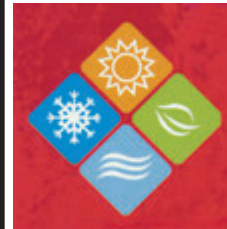


