Dear Parishioners,

It's nearly the 2nd week of October, a month marked by special observances in the liturgical life of the Catholic Church. St. Francis of Assisi (Oct 4), Our Lady of the Rosary (Oct 7), and St. John XXIII, Pope (Oct 11) to name a few. Friday, Oct 13th, is the date of the 100th Anniversary of Our Lady's Apparitions at Fatima, Portugal. Many graces will certainly be gained through our prayers during this time.

Let me report to you concerning the project of Installing and Connecting a New Boiler for the Hall and Annex.

Back in March, the boiler used to heat the Hall and Annex Classrooms malfunctioned, overheated and caused an internal fireball which melted controls and warped critical components of the unit. An insurance inspection determined the loss was not covered but we were required to have some incidental asbestos remediated. That work was completed and we passed the air quality inspection, certified by the State of New Jersey.

Two Bids were received for the project involving the installation of a new boiler plus several circulators, valves, piping etc. needing to be replaced. A local contractor, B-Shore Heating & Cooling was one of two bids submitted. Bert Rappa, Plumbing Service was awarded the contract, which needed the approval of the Finance Office of the Camden Diocese located in Camden. Photo documentation was provided. Mr. Rappa has serviced many schools and parishes with heating/boiler/AC issues and comes well recommended. I have used his services in a prior parish and was well pleased.

This financial "hit" is significant and has required us to withdraw Funds from our Diocesan Parish Savings Account, held in Camden. I believe you can appreciate how critical this project is to maintaining our facilities in a safe manner. Our Religious Education classes make use of the classrooms as do our Legion of Mary, Knights of Columbus, Confirmation students, Yoga participants, Bingo on Fridays, Youth Ministry and Prayer participants. Wednesday through Saturday nights, support groups occupy many classrooms (AA, Al-Anon and Gamblers Anonymous) and each of these offer a financial offering for the privilege of using our attractive and welcoming facility.

The funds raised during the upcoming 750 Club Dinner, Dance and Drawing on Veterans Day, November 11th are critically necessary to help us cover this extraordinary project. The Committee understands this to be the largest single annual fundraiser for our parish, and the members have agreed to actively solicit prizes for a fantastic Chinese Auction. Kenny I will play and entertain. The need to limit one dinner per sold ticket was thoughtfully decided in light of our parish's need to meet and exceed the expenses of the Hall Boiler Project.

I am confident that working together as a community, we will achieve our fundraiser goal. I look forward to being able to place a telephone call, maybe to YOU, congratulating you on being a large Cash Prize Winner during the Raffle Drawing! Good Luck. Tickets are available after Mass and during the week at the Office.

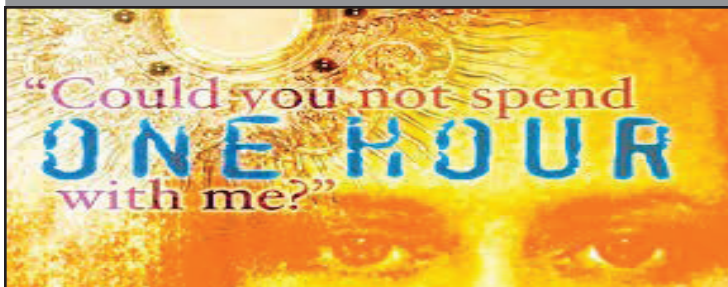

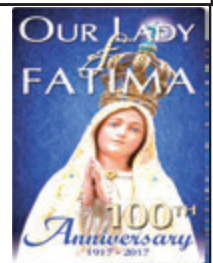

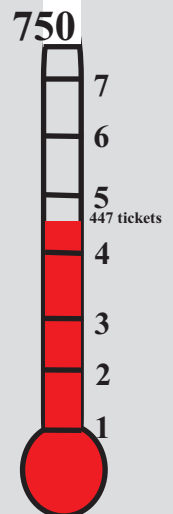

The Catholic RCIA Stages

DO YOU KNOW ANYONE thinking of joining the Roman Catholic Church? The Catholic RCIA stages are a good model of basic faith development. This article provides some detailed guidance for that process. ***PLEASE PASS THIS PAGE ON TO ANYONE YOU MAY ENCOUNTER THAT HAS SHOWN AN INTEREST IN THE CATHOLIC FAITH.***

THEN HAVE THEM CALL THE PARISH OFFICE (927-1154) TO INQUIRE.

- Where to start?
- Why so many “stages” of initiation?
- What should they be doing in each stage?
- How will they know when they are ready to move forward?

This article is your best starting point to answer these questions, and more. I’ll provide you with some fundamentals – centered in Christ – for beginning and developing your life of faith in the Roman Catholic Church. **Everything** else builds on these fundamentals!

But...Where do they begin?

Well, they just begin from where they are **now!** Many adults entering the Catholic Church, or those just thinking about it, follow a process known as the **RCIA** – the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults**.

The RCIA process has several distinct stages. These Catholic RCIA stages are a **good model** of faith

development itself, so this article will fit you whether or not you’re actually in the RCIA process.

- **Inquiry:** the initial period before you decide to enter the Catholic Church. You’re asking questions and checking it out, but aren’t yet ready to commit.
- **Catechumenate:** those who decide to enter the Church and are being trained for a life in Christ are called *catechumens*, an ancient name from the early Church. In this stage, you’re developing your faith and are being “catechized” – learning catechism, or the basic points about Catholic faith and life.
- **Purification and preparation:** The Church will help you focus and intensify your faith as you prepare you to commit your life to Christ and be received into the Church at Easter. If you’re following the RCIA process, you’ll go through a beautiful series of Gospel-based meditations during Lent, which is the time frame of this period.
- **Initiation** itself, the culmination of the whole process! You’re received into the Church during the Easter Vigil Mass, where you’ll receive the sacraments of initiation: baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist. (If you’ve already been baptized, you won’t be baptized again.)
- **Mystagogy:** after reception into the Church at Easter, this period lets you reflect and learn more about the mysteries of the Mass and the Sacraments that you now participate in fully.

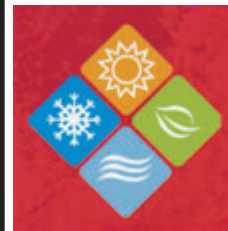
