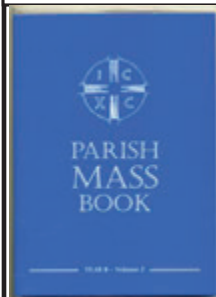

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson



Winter 2018 was seemingly extra long weather wise and spring snowstorms only served to prolong the pain. In many warm hearts, especially those of gardeners and flower lovers, the call to be outdoors planting seeds, bulbs or bushes was especially urgent. When Jesus walked here on earth among us in His human nature, His loving eyes and keen perception saw such planting going on for more than thirty seasons. Ever conscious of His saving mission and the need to teach people about the restorative plan of His heavenly Father, and being an excellent teacher, He used what was right in front of Him and His audience as starting points for comparison. It was, in His day, a largely agricultural society. So he turned to seeds, crops, plants, trees and flowers to exemplify features of the higher ground of His kingdom. He insisted that it was something that started small and looked insignificant but grew by design into something great. It flourished in the “rich soil” of open hearts and minds. Such is still true for us who hear His descriptions these many centuries later. While we can assert that the kingdom of God subsists in the Catholic Church, it is not so confined that it cannot branch out. It exists therefore anywhere human hearts acknowledge and love the one true God. That fact should be encouraging to us who are constantly confronted in our society by hearts of a different kind. They are turned inward, and nearly lost to goodness without a conversion experience that enables them to see the truth. They seem to monopolize the airwaves and dominate the definition of normalcy. This is all the more reason why we are needed today as agents of change. Our lives, our good example, consistent and steady, are the principal ways and means whereby we stir them to reflect and turn toward Christ. We water and fertilize the tiny seed in their souls, so to speak, that grows into a new person. One more alive than the old one by far. So we dare not neglect our duty as gardeners for greatness. It is true that many believers have difficulty in realizing and facing up to the fact that sometimes God uses time in His development of our Christian life. This truth is brought home by the following story. One day in the House of Commons, British Prime Minister Disraeli made a brilliant speech on the spur of the moment. That night a lady friend said to him, “I must tell you how much I enjoyed your extemporaneous talk. It’s been on my mind all day.” “Madam,” confessed Disraeli, “that extemporaneous talk has been on my mind for twenty years!”

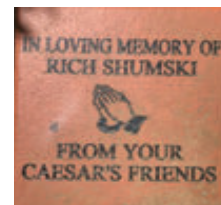

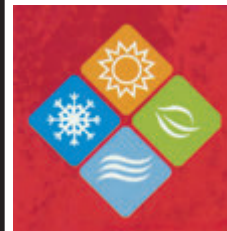
