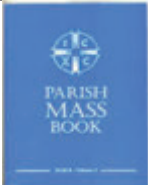

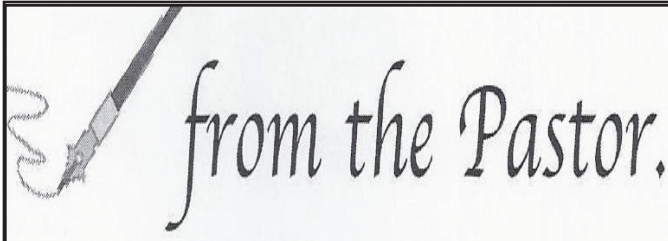
Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, 'Peace be with you.' But they were startled and frightened..." LUKE 24:36-37

A word of appreciation concerning the recent Healing Mass and Sacrament of Anointing celebrated on April 11th. Hundreds attended, many went to confession (2 1/2 hours spent by 3 priests to forgive sins). Fr. Damian and Fr. Lobo concelebrated the Healing Mass. Fr. Hare elected to continue hearing confessions for another 60 minutes, then led the prayers and gave a talk preceding the Anointing of the Sick. The Holy Spirit was active among us and inspiring music was offered by several Hospitaler Sisters of Mercy from Villa Raffaella. Since the sacrament of Anointing is recorded in the Church’s ledger, there were 146 individuals who asked to have the priests hands laid on their heads and have the Oil of the Sick placed on their forehead and upturned palms of the hands.

Fr. Damian, Fr. Lobo and I were very moved by the great company of believers who actively participated in this Lenten “triple-play” of Confession, Mass and Anointing. Fr. Damian offered a powerful message of God’s Loving desire to heal us.

We wish Fr. Damian “God’s Blessing” in return as he takes up a ministry appointment soon in Kentucky. Fr. Lobo also will be re-locating to Kentucky shortly. Thank you for sharing your priestly gifts with our community at Our Lady of Sorrows.

May we each strive to become ever more courageous in being a Disciple of the Risen Lord, Jesus Christ!

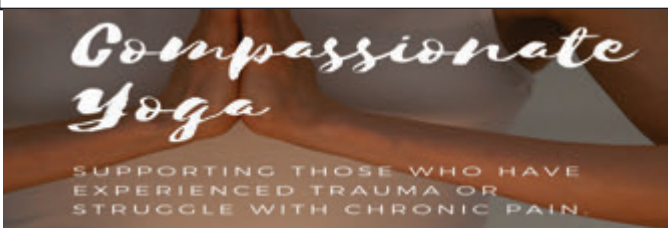

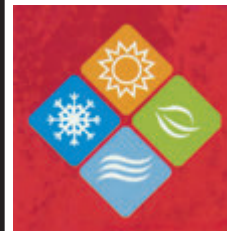
