Dear Parishioners,

June, 2020

The Bishop announced the effective RE-OPENING DATE of our Churches for Public Mass: the weekend of June 13-14th. So we are into our second week of Masses on Sunday and daily Mass. Giving you the opportunity to receive Jesus in the Eucharist will be a most welcomed gift!

Be Mindful

- The obligation to attend Mass is still “Lifted” by the Bishop, as is the fulfilling of the “Easter Duty” (confession of mortal sin and worthy reception of the Eucharist).
- You must not come to Mass if you are sick, have a fever or chronic cough etc.
- You should not come to Mass if you are over 65 and have underlying health conditions, which put you at greater risk.
- You may choose to stay at home if you feel uncomfortable in any way about being in the church building or being among other persons at this time.

Preparations By Parish

The Church has been professionally sanitized for everyone’s safety. Our janitorial contractor has been scrubbing the church twice a week since the shutdown. The limited hours of Church visitation are: Monday-Friday 7:00 a.m.-12:00 Noon; Saturday, 7:00 a.m.-9:00 a.m. and 3:45 p.m.-7:00 p.m.; Sunday, 7:00 a.m.-12:00 noon and 5:30 p.m.-8:00 p.m.

Our Parish Mass and Services Schedule Limited Capacity 120 max

- Confession on Saturday 3:45 – 4:45pm (screen or face-to-face)
- Saturday Vigil Mass 5pm
- Sunday 8am
- Sunday 10am This Mass will be live-streamed, replacing the 10:30am time we followed during the closure period
- Sunday 6:30pm

Weekday Mass

- 7:45am Monday through Friday, Capacity limit: 110 persons
- Tuesday evening 6:30pm followed by St. Anthony Novena, Relic Blessing only
- Saturday Morning Mass 8am

Perpetual Adoration still remains suspended at this time. Church visiting hours during the day had to be curtailed in light of maintaining sanitizing standards now.

How to proceed upon arrival

We will OPEN and OBSERVE the following limitations: We ask for your understanding and willing compliance for everyone’s good.

Volunteers will assist you upon arrival directing you to the hand sanitizing stations, and assisting you generally to find a seat.

- **ENTER CHURCH** by Lobby doors off the Parking lot
- **EXIT CHURCH** by Lobby doors on the Hall side of the Lobby as well as the **EXIT DOOR** near the Pulpit (parking lot side)
- You must wear a mask at all times in the church (except children under age 2)
- Church capacity, reduced to 25% or 120 persons; All who enter will be counted so as to guarantee that we **DO NOT EXCEED 120 individuals**.

Once we reach capacity, we will announce that and encourage those remaining outside to come to the next Mass or watch the Mass on Facebook or YouTube.

- the observance of 6' social distancing (decals marked on the church floor)
- active use of hand sanitizing stations (3 in lobby)
- Pews are marked by a tape located half-way down the pew length for spacing
- Behind each IN USE pew will be two unused pews (roped off with red tape)

Each pew can accommodate these possibilities:

Family members seated next to one another or

3 individuals (1 at each end plus one in center) or

Two couples, seated together, but spaced at each end of the pew

- No Missalettes or Hymnals will be available; readings are printed in the parish bulletin.
- **The Cry Room will be locked and access to the Bathroom will be on an “emergency only” basis** as we cannot sanitize after each person’s use. Please use your facilities at home before coming to church.
- Ushers will not take up a collection; instead place your **OFFERTORY** in the secure **box in the rear of the Church** or the secure **box located by the Pulpit EXIT** door.
- The reception of Holy Communion will take place once Mass has ended.
- The Priest will remove his chasuble, sanitize his hands and then remove the ciboria from the tabernacle and place it on the Altar. He will pray: “Behold the Lamb of God.....supper of the Lamb” We reply: “Lord I am not worthy to....but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.” You may return to your pew to make a thanksgiving prayer.
- Approach the Communion station, having removed your mask, keep 6’ distance, extend your hands for Father to place the host into your hands. “Body of Christ” say “AMEN”. Turn to the left and follow to the EXIT of the church near the pulpit. The OFFERTORY BOX will be there on the left side as you depart.
- You may receive Communion and turn to the right, and proceed down the side aisle to the Lobby and turn left and EXIT to the left, through the lobby doors facing the Hall. You may place your OFFERTORY in the secure box at the rear of the church or at the side exit door near the pulpit.

As you face financial planning decisions, so does Our Lady of Sorrows. I am most grateful for your continued financial giving to our Offertory. We ask you to mail your offertory collection to the parish or place them in the labeled box at the baptismal font in the rear of the church. Your continued faithful support is more than ever, both critical and deeply appreciated.

In light of personal health factors, both Fr. Cal LaVerde and Deacon Joe Lonergan will no longer be regularly celebrating Mass on the weekends. I will be requesting help from the Missionaries of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary as well as from other active and retired priests living in the area.

I look forward with joy and happiness in sharing the Holy Eucharist together as a Parish community going forward.
