

FIRST READING: SIR 3:2-6, 12-14

December 27, 2021

GOSPEL - Luke 2:22-40

When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, *Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord*, and to offer the sacrifice of *a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons*, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, He took him into his arms and blessed God, saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel." The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted —and you yourself a sword will pierce— so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

From the PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners.

The wonderfully familiar greetings of wishing others a Merry Christmas has hopefully enhanced the joy and hopefulness of the season. For most of us, there were no large gatherings of family members. We sent electronic greetings and logged into Zoom Meetings in order to be able to “speak to and be seen” by our close family and friends. It’s all part of discovering a path to a new normal in maintaining relationships that are vital to keeping us healthy in mind, heart and spirit. Today’s Feast of the Holy Family, invites us to take a longer look at how Mary and Joseph and Jesus began to shape this new stage of life, a stage blessed by the providence of God and ratified by their consent to follow the plan.

What was involved in “following the plan” you might ask? Consider the adjustments that Joseph and Mary experienced as newlyweds. Moving in together, learning more about each other’s personality, and being about the tasks of creating a home life together for themselves and for a child growing within Mary’s body. Joseph worked as a carpenter which enabled him to provide for his family. Mary would be reassured to know that Joseph would accompany her at every stage of her pregnancy. She would come to count on him as her spouse and protector. They would each learn the power of the commitment they promised one another as they embraced their marriage covenant. The birth of their son proved to begin a new chapter in their family, a saga we all know by heart as the Christmas Message is recounted each year at this time. For more details of the early family life of Joseph, Mary and the child Jesus, we must search for the very limited information provided in the Scripture. The Holy Family fled to Egypt to avoid their child being killed by Herod’s soldiers (The Murder of the Innocents). Jesus was left behind in the Temple at age 13 after a pilgrimage made by his parents. He returned home to Nazareth and was “subject to them”. The child advanced in wisdom, age and grace before God and man.

It remains for us to reflect on how Joseph and Mary exercised their skills as nurturing parents. Jesus progressed through every stage of growth, starting as an infant. Diaper changing, teaching language, making every effort to raise their “blessed son” to appreciate being part of a family and larger religious community as a Jew. It all started with an Angel Gabriel message and Mary saying “Yes”. Consider your own family’s history and circumstance during this Christmas Season and be grateful for it!

May this upcoming new year of 2021 provide us with renewed energy, health and hope!

WHAT THE CARES ACT MEANS FOR CHARITABLE GIVING

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act creates two temporary changes to the tax treatment of such donations. One is a universal deduction targeted primarily at the 90% of standard deduction taxpayers, and the other is meant to incentivize the remaining high-income givers and corporations.

\$300

Universal Deduction
for Donations Up to
\$300

For the 9 out of 10 people who no longer itemize their charitable giving, the CARES Act will allow these individual taxpayers to deduct donations to charity of up to \$300 on their 2020 federal tax return, even though they take the standard deduction.

60%

For those donors who are still able to itemize their deductions, and therefore directly write off gifts to charity, the current deduction cap is 60% of adjusted gross income. Corporations are able to deduct charitable donations up to 10% of taxable income.

*The 60% of AGI limit is for giving to 501(c)(3) public charities. The deductibility of gifts to 501(c)(3) private foundations is capped at 30%, and was not included in this legislation.

WHAT ABOUT THE IRA QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD: they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.
