GOSPEL: Mark 7:31-37

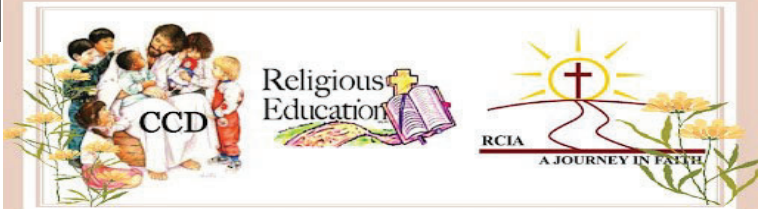

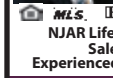
