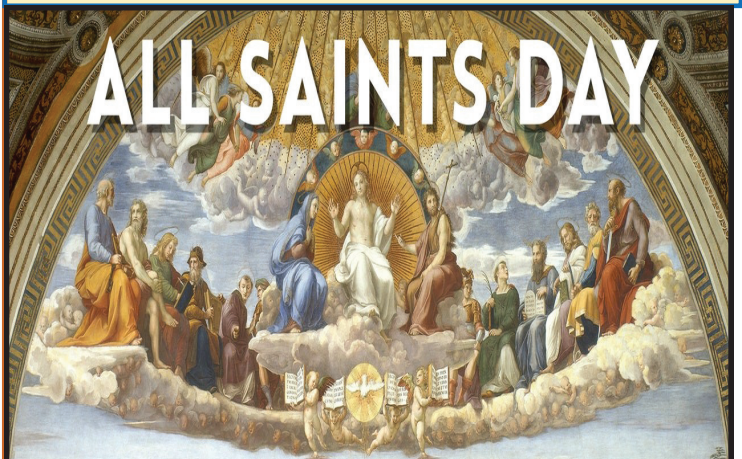

Brothers and sisters: The levitical priests were many because they were prevented by death from remaining in office, but Jesus, because he remains forever, has a priesthood that does not pass away. Therefore, he is always able to save those who approach God through him, since he lives forever to make intercession for them. It was fitting that we should have such a high priest: holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners, higher than the heavens. 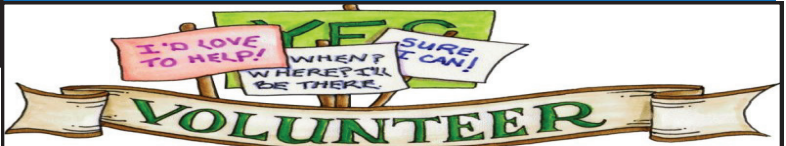

*XVI Ordinary General Assembly
of the Synod of Bishops
October 10, 2021-October 21, 2023*

There have been 15 previous such Assemblies since St. Paul VI established the Synod process at the conclusion of the Second Vatican Council. He did so to broaden the

consultation that the Holy Father and the Holy See receive on specific issues.

This Synod will ultimately discuss the synodal nature of the Church. Rooted in an understanding of “the sense of the faithful” among the members of the Church, Pope Francis wants to broaden the consultation by inviting the faithful throughout the world to listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit in their experience of the Church. At the same time Pope Francis hopes this process will give, we the faithful, a voice—and increase our participation in the life of the Church, deepening our communion with the Church and helping us to live out the mission of the Church.

A Synod is a fancy word for “meeting” and emphasized the need for an active participation rather than a simple passive reception of information. By our speaking and listening, we are encouraged to share our stories and together uncover the Holy Spirit’s movement in our midst. The Holy Spirit has the power to reveal that which leads to holiness and that which remains an obstacle to holiness—both need to be known.

What is the goal? Our modern world provides countless ways for people to communicate but at the same time requires NEW WAYS of proclaiming the Gospel—the Good News that God in Jesus took on flesh, suffered, died and was raised from the dead to give meaning to our lives and the hope of life eternal. How are we as members and how is the Church Universal making that proclamation? What needs to happen to spread the Good News in the world today?

Five members of our Parish have accepted the invitation to serve as Parish Delegates. They include: Tricia Hughes, Toni Rochow, Rob Switzer, Walt and Marge Spilker. We anticipate others joining them as “facilitators” in the listening meetings that are scheduled in the Hall following each Mass over the next month. The meetings will last for an hour. Light refreshments will be offered. The delegates have a role to be interested in understanding the insights that will be shared. They are called to be the “ears” of the Church, listening to what you as parishioners share about your experience of the Church, your journey of faith and your hopes for what the Church can be. These delegates will be shepherds of a process, gathering the flock and facilitating a meeting providing an opportunity for you to share your experiences thereby revealing the “direction” of the Holy Spirit in this process. They will be “reporters” and are NOT responsible for answering your questions. They will take

notes, gathering what they hear to craft a Parish Report of what was collectively heard at the meetings. This report will be shared within the Deanery and forwarded to the Camden Diocesan Synod Office. Please consult the Schedule of Meetings to be held during November, printed in this bulletin. Please pray for the success of this Synod.
